

Day 1: Wednesday, October 14, 2026 Overnight Flight You're on your way to South Africa and Namibia, two nations with intertwined histories and some of the most incredible landscapes, wildlife, and cultural diversity in the world. Get ready for a truly unique experience, from the dunes of Sossusvlei to the coasts of Cape Town.

Day 2: Thursday, October 15, 2026 Johannesburg, South Africa Arrive in Johannesburg after your overnight flight. Get settled at your airport hotel and rest before tomorrow's morning flight to Namibia. As arrival times will vary, there are no scheduled activities today. Setting in at your own pace, perhaps exploring the city independently.

Day 3: Friday, October 16, 2026 Johannesburg - Windhoek, Namibia - Sossusvlei Today, fly to Windhoek, Namibia's capital city. One of Southern Africa's most fascinating destinations, Namibia is one of the youngest countries in Africa and one of the least populated in the world. With its recent independence from South Africa, this frontier nation is a surprise to most. After landing in Windhoek, start your adventure with a road journey to Sossusvlei, one of Namibia's most stunning landmarks. Arrive at your lodge after a day of travel, just in time to settle in and enjoy your first dinner with your traveling companions. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Saturday, October 17, 2026 Sossusvlei Embark on the experience of a lifetime. Start the day early to ensure the best experience at one of Namibia's most dramatic landscapes – the red sand dunes of Deadvlei in the Namib desert. A landscape reminiscent of science fiction movies, the Sossusvlei region is home to some of the world's tallest dunes. Climb one of these epic dunes to access Deadvlei,* a salt pan famous for its ancient petrified trees. A paradise for photographers and scenery enthusiasts alike, the Namib desert will leave lasting memories. See firsthand how animals survive in this harsh environment, and look for its most famous resident – the oryx! (B, L, D)


Day 5: Sunday, October 18, 2026 Sossusvlei - Swakopmund Say farewell to the Namib desert and set out on another epic journey as you take a long, scenic drive to the coastal town of Swakopmund. With its German colonial architecture, marine wildlife, and access to the Skeleton Coast, Swakopmund is a unique desert oasis. This afternoon, visit the Welwitschia Plains and Moon Valley for another look at what makes Namibia so unique – its hyper-arid landscape creates the perfect conditions for endemic species of plants seen nowhere else. (B, D)

Day 6: Monday, October 19, 2026 Swakopmund This morning, drive to Walvis Bay and join a marine cruise to search for seals, pelicans, and dolphins. Learn from your cruise guides what makes this area so unique for these marine animals. Continue your exploration to Pelican Point for a glimpse of some pink feathered friends and a view of what makes this coastline so famous – its numerous ship wrecks. (B)

Day 7: Tuesday, October 20, 2026 Swakopmund - Etosha National Park Leave this coastal beauty behind as we head to your second Namibian National Park – Etosha. During your longest land transfer on this adventure, stop for a tasting and lunch at a winery paving the way for Namibian wines and spirits. Later this afternoon, check in to your rustic lodge and settle in before dinner overlooking the African bush. (B, L, D)

Day 8: Wednesday, October 21, 2026 Etosha National Park Early this morning, depart for your first game drive. In open safari vehicles, search for rhino, giraffe, lions, elephants, and several types of antelopes. Ostriches will welcome you at every corner and wildebeest will greet you at watering holes. Return to your lodge for lunch before departing for your afternoon game drive. End the day with memories of salt flats and wild animals thriving in a surreal landscape. (B, L, D)

Day 9: Thursday, October 22, 2026 Etosha National Park Today, take a break from safari vehicles and join a full day game drive in an enclosed vehicle. If you wish, you may choose to upgrade to open vehicles (if your adventurous side has not yet been satiated!). (B, D)

Day 10: Friday, October 23, 2026 Etosha National Park - Windhoek Travel your last Namibian leg of this journey and arrive back in its capital city, Windhoek. Despite it being the capital, enjoy its calm atmosphere during your free afternoon before you join your fellow travelers at dinner to reminisce about your adventure in Namibia. (B, D)

Day 11: Saturday, October 24, 2026 Windhoek - Cape Town, South Africa End your time in Namibia with a meaningful visit to Penduka during an **Impact Moment**. With its mission to support gender equality and empower women, learn how Penduka supports the local community through traditional craftwork and skill sharing. Then, travel to the airport for your flight to Cape Town, South Africa, and end your day as a guest of honor in a Capetonian family's home. Over dinner, exchange stories and get to know what everyday life is like here in Cape Town. (B, D)

Day 12: Sunday, October 25, 2026 Cape Town Get to see the natural side of Cape Town today. Travel to Cape Point, the southwestern tip of Africa. Marvel at the vibrant green foliage blanketing the rocky outcrops, contrasting the bright blue waves below. Visit the Cape of Good Hope and stop at Boulders Beach for the rarest of black-tie events – a rendezvous with endangered African penguins! Return to the city via Table Bay. (B, L)

Day 13: Monday, October 26, 2026 Cape Town Today, explore South Africa's eclectic cultural mecca. Rise gently over the South African landscape in a cable car to Table Mountain,** taking in views of Cape Town, Lions Head, and historic Robben Island. Then, view the city's heritage sites, historic landmarks, and bustling city center during a city tour. Enjoy a free afternoon to relax at your hotel or to further explore this fascinating city as you wish. (B)

Day 14: Tuesday, October 27, 2026 Cape Town - Johannesburg - Kruger National Park Say goodbye to city life and hello to South Africa's stunning natural beauty. Board your flight to Johannesburg as you make your way to Kruger National Park, the largest game reserve in South Africa. Then, a six-hour drive will bring you to the unmatched beauty of the African savanna. Check in to your hotel, ideally located at the entrance of the park on the banks of the Sabie River. (B, D)

Day 15: Wednesday, October 28, 2026 Kruger National Park Pack your camera as you head off on a full day game drive! Search for the "Big 5" from your open-air vehicle and experience some iconic South African scenery. Relax with a picnic lunch within the park, before setting off again for your afternoon game drive. (B, L, D)

Day 16: Thursday, October 29, 2026 Kruger National Park Head out again on another full-day game drive for your last opportunity to see all the majestic scenery and animals you have come this far to experience. Tonight, join your fellow explorers for dinner and toast farewell to all the extraordinary places you've encountered during this epic African adventure. (B, L, D)

Day 17: Friday, October 30, 2026 Kruger National Park - Johannesburg - Tour Ends Bid farewell to your fellow travelers when you leave Kruger for Johannesburg and head back home.*** (B)

Important Tour Information:

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 4. This means you're ready to seize the day, whatever it may bring. You lead an active life at home (walking, biking, and half or full day hikes are things you may enjoy) and 10,000 steps a day is normal for you. You can handle longer walking tours

(more than 3 hours covering 3+ miles at a steady clip) and activities that involve traversing uneven terrain, steep slopes, standing for periods of time, and varying altitudes and temperatures. You don't mind being on the go with some early starts, late nights, and full days. You can handle altitudes of 9,000 feet or higher with little to no issue. This level is not appropriate for travelers who use wheelchairs, walkers, and other mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 13 people (maximum of 18).

In order to most fully experience the wildlife, you will be traveling by custom-built safari vehicles which require some agility to climb in and out. We recommend that all travelers be in reasonably good health and prepare properly.

Unfortunately, wheelchairs cannot be accommodated on this trip. In addition, travelers who require assistance walking or who travel with oxygen tanks will not fully enjoy this trip, and we strongly recommend a different tour.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

This tour covers over 1500 miles (2414 kilometers) of road, mostly through rough, dusty, and bumpy terrain.

*To access the petrified trees of Deadvlei, you must be able to climb approximately 1 mile (1.6 kilometers) in deep sand. You should be comfortable walking in sand for 30-40 minutes without shade in potentially hot conditions.

Maximum Elevation: 5751 feet / 1753 meters.

This tour includes six long days of overland transfers, each covering a minimum of 200 miles and involving four to eight hours of driving over unpaved, bumpy roads.

The drive from Swakopmund to Etosha National Park will include a total of 6 hours of driving and cover over 300 miles (485 kms). The drive from Etosha National Park to Windhoek will include 4 hours of driving and cover over 250 miles (410 kms). There will be plenty of rest stops during these long drive days.

Your flight from Johannesburg to Namibia may require an early morning departure (before 6:00 a.m.) to allow for drive time and a comfortable arrival at your resort in Windhoek.

**Table Mountain Cableway is subject to weather conditions.

You will have two separate Tour Managers throughout your trip; one while traveling in Namibia and another while traveling through South Africa.

Wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.

Personal audio devices (headsets) are not included on this tour.

Single accommodations are extremely limited. Single rate subject to change based on availability. Triple accommodations are not available.

To complete your tour, we include round-trip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of *purchasing* these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.

***Due to tour scheduling, return flights should not be scheduled prior to 6:30 pm.

Internal flights are required in order to participate on this tour and are included in the final price, quoted at time of booking.

Park fees starting from approximately \$60 USD per person (subject to change without advance notice), quoted at time of booking, are payable at time of final payment.

Economy air rate and schedule are applicable for groups of 10 or more traveling on the same flights and dates.

Travel Requirements:

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. You are strongly urged to contact the appropriate consulate for details. Visit www.travel.state.gov for the U.S. State Department for the latest details about passports and visa requirements.

IMPORTANT: We recommend that travelers take a photocopy of their passport and applicable visas. It should be packed separately from your actual passport and visa. We also recommend leaving a copy at home with your emergency contact.

A visa is required for USA, Canadian, Australian, and New Zealand nationals to travel to Namibia and should be applied for in advance. Travel insurance is a requirement to apply for this visa. A visa is not required for USA, Canadian, Australian, or New Zealand citizens to travel to South Africa for stays of 90 days or less.

If you purchase our Travel Protection Plan (TPP), we will supply you with all the necessary information and documentation, including a letter of proof of insurance.

You must have at least 5 blank pages (with visa hologram) remaining in your passport to allow for the entry stamps issued for South Africa and Namibia. The 2 pages for each instance of entry to South Africa **MUST** be facing each other. Failure to comply with this law will result in denied boarding of your international flight. Passports must have at least six months of validity remaining beyond your planned date of departure. If you have questions please see your travel professional or call us.

If you are traveling with children under the age of 18, South Africa requires that those children must have proper documentation and/or consent when traveling into or out of the Republic. Please refer to www.dha.gov.za/index.php/statements-speeches/621-advisory-new-requirements-for-children-travelling-through-south-african-ports-of-entry-effective-1-june-2015 for the most up-to-date details on requirements. Please check directly with the airline for the legal documentation that is required. It is the sole responsibility of the traveler to procure the proper documentation to travel and many requirements vary by airline and destination.

Malaria pills are recommended when visiting Namibia. Consult your physician 2-3 weeks prior to departure. A valid international certificate of vaccination against Yellow Fever is required in many countries if you are arriving from a country with risk of yellow fever (e.g. Kenya). You may need to present this on arrival at the airport or border crossing. Some countries will refuse entry if you are unable to present your certificate. It's also quite common for your home country to request a Yellow Fever certificate on your arrival back home.

Each traveler is responsible for proper documentation and inoculations that may be required and/or recommended to participate on this tour. Please contact your local travel clinic or personal physician for specific details on the destinations you are traveling to and from.

Please be aware that if your flight schedule is via Dubai or if you are stopping over in Dubai and are carrying narcotic drugs, controlled or semi-controlled drugs, then you will be required to complete an electronic form prior to entering the country, to obtain approval to carry medication. Please use the link <https://mohap.gov.ae/en/services/issue-of-permit-to-import-medicines-for-personal-use> to view the guidelines. A user's guide is available to explain the application and the supporting documents required.

Day 17: Kruger National Park - Mpumalanga - Victoria Falls - Livingstone

Travel to Kruger Mpumalanga International Airport and board your flight to Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe, before crossing the border into Zambia and arriving in Livingstone. Located on the banks of the mighty Zambezi River, Livingstone is the perfect access point to the extraordinary Victoria Falls - one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the world and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Check in to your lodge before heading out on a sunset sundowner cruise. Enjoy views of the river, its banks, and the animals that call it home. Look out for hippos and elephants as they may surprise you with an afternoon appearance.

Day 18: Livingstone

Experience the Falls! With your local expert, learn about the majestic Victoria Falls and its surrounding areas. Experience the roar as you approach and see for yourself why this is one of the most visited sites in the world. After lunch, visit the Mukuni village where you'll be welcomed by its chief and where you may get a glimpse into the traditions and customs of the Leya people. Return to your lodge at the end of the day for an evening at leisure. *Today breakfast and lunch will be included.*

You will require 4 blank pages in your passport to allow for entry stamps into Zimbabwe and Zambia. A visa is not required for nationals of USA, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand into Zambia.

Travelers are responsible to pay local park and river fees directly, in cash, at points of entry, for a total cost of \$30 USD, per person.

Internationally, a great deal of walking may be necessary to fully enjoy the destination. Travelers should be in good health and must be able to walk reasonable distances. In some areas, travelers may be required to walk on uneven ground, cobblestone streets or raised thresholds.

****To request a wheelchair accessible room on a cruise, the traveler or person sharing the room must have a recognized disability that alters a major life function and requires the use of a mobility device and the use of the accessible features provided in the wheelchair accessible stateroom. The cruise company may take appropriate action against someone who has reserved or purchased such a stateroom fraudulently.
